Famine in East Africa

- Tens of thousands of children have already died due to starvation
- 4 million children are still affected by the famine in East Africa
- Young children continue to die from not only hunger but also from outbreaks of measles, cholera and malaria
- The East Africa famine was caused by ongoing drought and exacerbated by high and rising food prices



What can you do at your school?

Some examples include:

1. Mufti days
2. Cake sales, boot sales
3. Fashion shows

5. Collect coins from the public
6. Give up soft drinks/ lollies/ junk food/ coffee, pocket money for a week/ a day

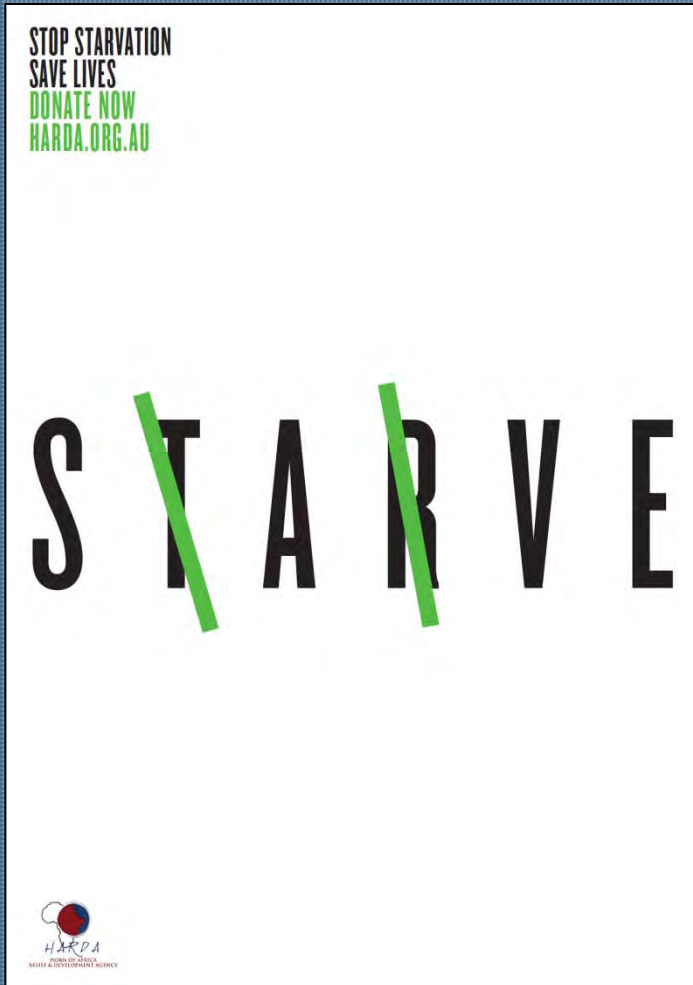

HARDA Work on the Famine

- HARDA has sent over \$168,000 in famine relief to date
- **100%** of all funds received are transmitted directly to African Non-Government Organisations (NGOs)
- Food aid has been delivered in many instances within 5 - 7 days of the money being received
- HARDA is working with NGOs in Somalia, Kenya and Ethiopia to get supplies directly to those in need as efficiently as possible





HARDA on the Ground

On the ground partnerships

1. Kenya, Ethiopia & Somalia border

NGO based in Kenya has delivered food & medical aid for us for 3 years. In July distributed food to feed 6,000 people

2. Somalia

Working with one of the few NGOs operating inside Somalia. Extremely dangerous for aid workers so most do not take the risk

HARDA Survival Pack

- \$32 buys a survival pack to feed a family for a month; includes 5kg rice, 4kg maize, 2 packs pasta, 2.5kg salt & sugar, 3 lt milk powder
- \$5 can feed a child for seven days

- The Horn of Africa Relief and Development Agency (HARD A) is a non profit organisation that is entirely run by volunteers
- Mission - to unite refugees and from all Horn of Africa countries in Australia and work as advocates and lobbyist for their domestic and international issues and concerns
